Police Uplift Programme



Cheshire Constabulary has hired an **additional 322 officers**, meaning the county now has more officers than it has ever had.

Cyber Helpline Volunteer



Funded an extra post at a national charity that will work with the Harm Reduction Unit to support victim of cyber-stalking.

Cheshire Constabulary Scrutiny Meeting



Held a special scrutiny meeting to discuss the Constabulary's response to Violence against Women and Girls, and to seek reassurances that issues highlighted in Baroness Casey's recent review of the Metropolitan Police are not prevalent in Cheshire.

Young Drivers Event



Funded a driving skills event for 17-29 year olds working alongside **Cheshire Police, Cheshire Fire and Rescue, North West Ambulance Service, IAM RoadSmart and Youth Fed.**
